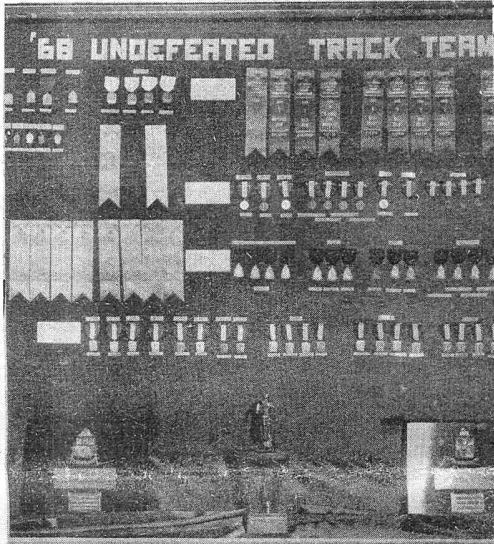


TALKY TOTS TAKE TRIP

The highlight of the school year for Baldwin's 1987-88 Speech and Debate Club came on March 23 at Canavin High School when seven of the members (three in Drama and four in extemp) competed in the district NFL finals. The contestants went two rounds, and then had to wait for what seemed an endless length of time for the results to be posted. A first, second or third place is considered an "up", and any place below third is a "down". One "up" is required to go on to the third round, and two "ups" out of all three rounds was needed to go on to the finals the week after. Ric Belle and Greg Carney in extemp, and Kathleen Donnelly in Drama all made it to the third round. By the end of the afternoon, only Ric and Kathy were left to represent Baldwin at finals, which were held the

following week at St. Benedicts. After the first Drama round, the six contestants left with three "ups" total from both weeks were grouped in one room for the final round. Out of the crowd of six contestants, five judges, and many spectators, the six thespians were listed in their order of excellence. Central Catholic took first and fourth places with Paddy Chayefsky's "Gideon" and "The Slaver" from John Brown's Body. The other selections which placed were Taylor-Aldredice's This Property is Condemned, Canavin's Joan of Arc, Baldwin's The Chalk Garden, and Our Town. In extemp, Ric Belle made it through the first round, but was eliminated in the second round. The extemp first place winners were not announced.



Track Team Undefeated 13-0

Back in early January, at a meeting for boys interested in going out for track, Baldwin's new track coach, Mr. McKinney, told the boys that there was room only for boys who wanted to win and willing to work hard to win. They have done much more than that as they proved to be the best track team in Baldwin's history and one of the best in the state. Over the course of the season they had completely rearranged the record book as almost every single existing school record was broken. They came through the dual meet season with a perfect 13-0 record as they continually swamped such track powers as Washington, Clairton, Mt. Lebanon, Bethel, Schaler, and many more. In the big invitational and relays, the Highlanders were always right near the top and always challenging Penn Hills, last year's WPIAL champs. This was a team who did not have to rely on a few individuals, but instead had great depth. They were sparked not only by the veterans of the team such as Galry DeMar in the shot and discus, Bob Schmidt and Lloyd Rogers in the hurdles, Ed Helbig in the 440, Kent Samul in the javalin; and Don Newell in the javalin, but also newcomers such as Gary Gittings, mile and half mile, Ed Marsteller, 440; John Schafer and Doug Davies, shot put; Jim Montgomery, Pole Vault, and Mike McKenzie broad jump. Also there is the mile relay team of Helbig, Mas-

steller, Schmidt, and Jeff Fieldson and the two mile relay team of Fieldson, Craig Lee, Dave Schrettinger and Jim Mehaffey. In Coach McKinney's words, the team was tremendous, hard working, dedicated and a great bunch of guys. Mr. McKinney was aided by coaches Mr. Anderson and Mr. Mizerak.

SWINGERS SURE HAVE DRIVE

The golf team has to be considered one of the best in the history of Baldwin Athletics. Over the past three years they have compiled a 59-3 win-loss record and have been WPIAL champions two of those three years. Coach Bectold inherited the reigns of leadership this year and was lucky to have returning two outstanding two-year veterans, Jim Conn and Gary Dixon. These boys have done tremendously the past two years and provide the nucleus for this year's team. Jim recently fired a 66 at South Hills Country Club. He also finished second at the WPIAL qualifiers. Gary is the main reason the team has been noted for its depth. He has consistently been turning in performances in the high 70's and low 80's. Other members on the team are Jim Camella, Mark Kalas, Bob Lau, and Kerrey Browne. The Purbalite would like to thank them for all the fine recognition they have brought to our school.

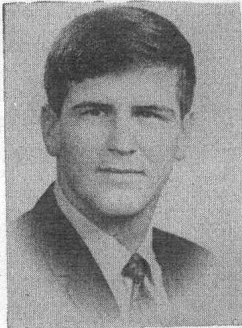

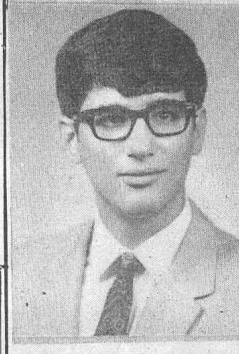
CHEERLEADING - PAT MORROW

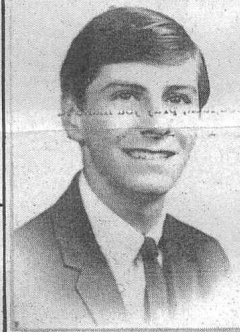
SWIMMING - BEV SCHMIDT

BASKETBALL - DAVE DRAKE

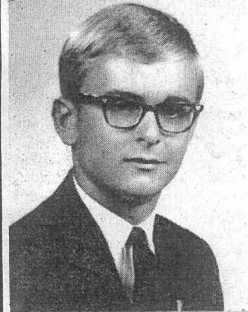

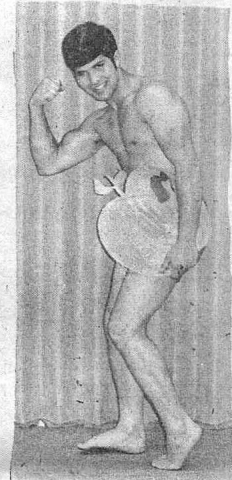
